

## National guidelines - Brazil

In order to comply with national requirements we are implementing the following further precautionary measures:

<b>Travel</b>	No travel is allowed between municipalities and states, but there is no guidance yet on the actions that must be taken after the "State of Emergency" has passed.
<b>Quarantine</b>	If any employee is contaminated or has had contact with someone infected, they must follow the guidelines of the municipality's health area and be quarantined. RelyOn Nutec Brazil has carefully followed what the Ministry of Health has been guiding.
<b>Social distancing</b>	We are following the guidelines of the Ministry of Health and the Municipality, where we must maintain social isolation and only leave if it is to go to markets, hospitals and pharmacies.
<b>Food hygiene</b>	In Brazil, food outside the home should only be delivery.
<b>Class sizes</b>	At the bases of Macaé and Rio de Janeiro, the realization of face-to-face classes is prohibited. We are only conducting virtual and digital training.  This prohibition comes from governments and accrediting / regulating bodies,
<b>Restrictions on courses/ methodology/ equipment</b>	It is only allowed to conduct distance and virtual training.
<b>Cleaning of equipment</b>	As we are not carrying out practical training at the bases, the maintenance sector is maintaining basic equipment hygiene.
<b>Other national specific guidelines</b>	Here in Brazil, there is a conflict between state and federal governments, so we still have no clear guidance on the next actions that must be taken.  We hope that things will become clearer at the end of April.
